Why it matters:

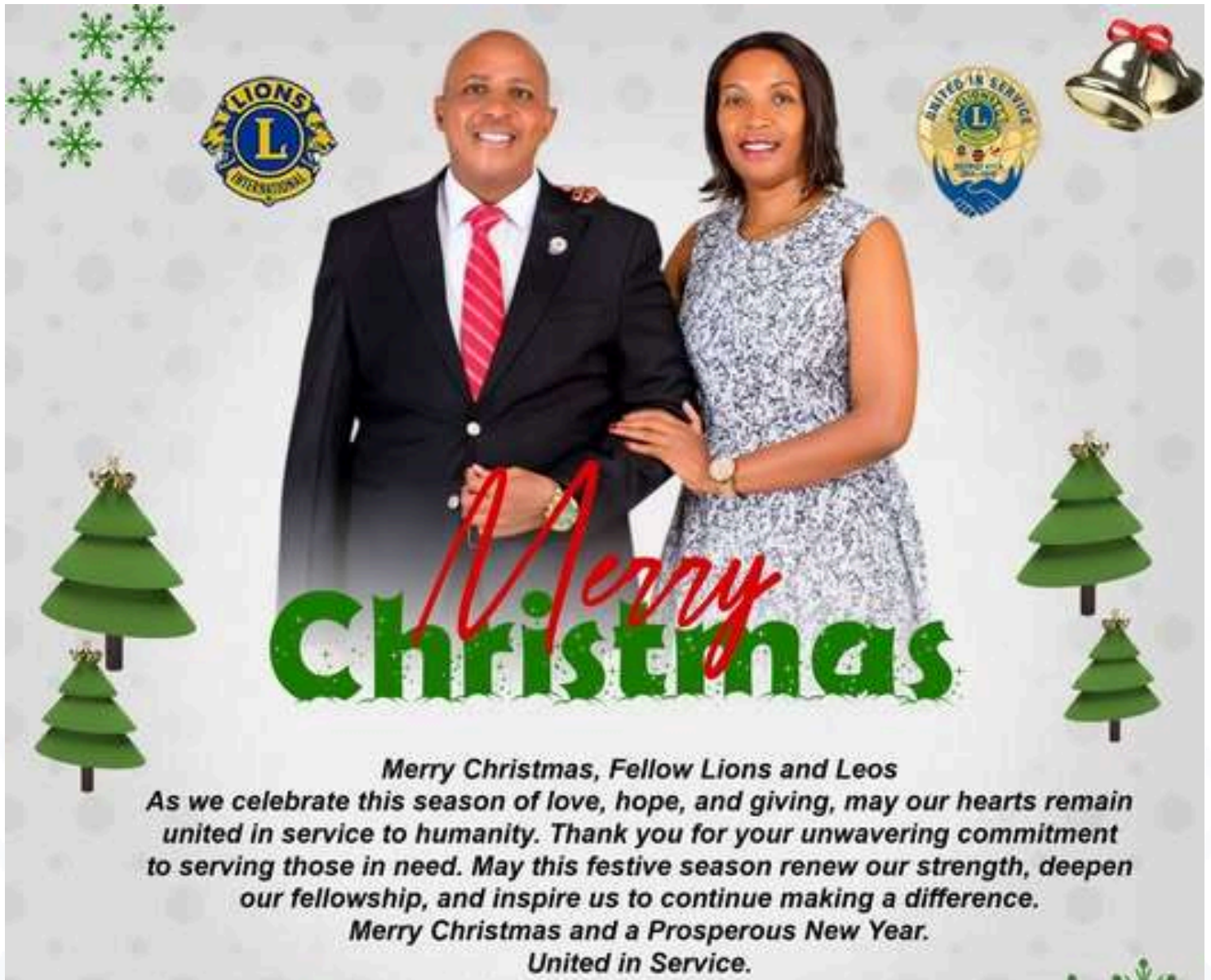
1. Stereotypes lead to stigma and discrimination

Part of her hospital bill was covered by SHA, leaving a balance of KShs 11,000, which a Lion from LC Mombasa Bahari helped settle through a Good Samaritan, enabling her discharge on 24th November. The club also provided milk, fruits, and beans, demonstrating that where there is need, there is a Lion.

Health Services Reach Kirinyaga

Lions Club of Nairobi Riverside donated a wheelchair to a deserving lady in Thika, reaffirming its continued commitment to compassionate service and support for those in need.





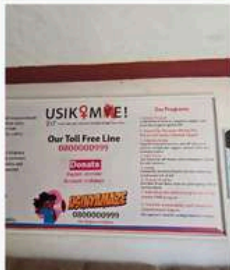
LIONS CLUB OF MASAKU PIONEER

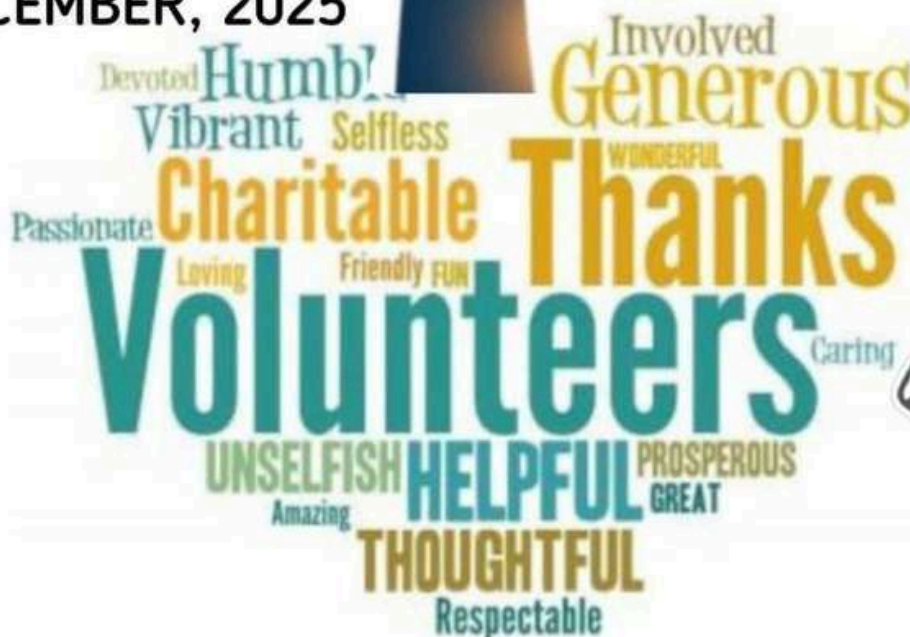

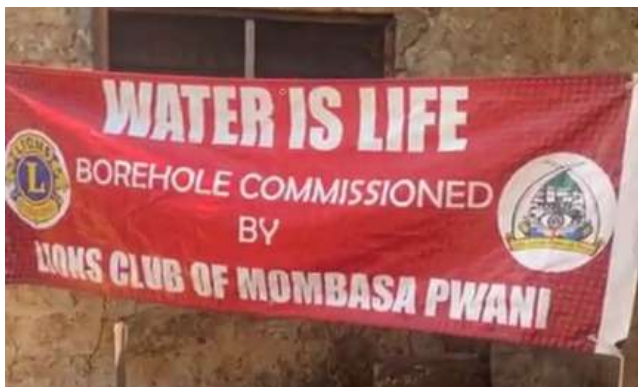
