The 96-bed facility will provide temporary accommodation and respite services for children undergoing cancer treatment and their caregivers. Led by Lions Clubs International District 411A in partnership with KNH and Kasigau Students Education Foundation, and sponsored by the Lions Clubs of Nairobi Riverside and Nairobi Elites, the project is among the largest of its kind in Africa.



Serving the Community

A total of 258 people were served, demonstrating continued commitment to health and community care.








Leo Club of Nairobi HURU Receives Eyeglass Donation
